Director, Primary Care and Branch Clinics

Naval Medical Center Portsmouth

The Director, Primary Care and Branch Health Clinics (DPC) maintains comprehensive oversight of primary care operations performed at ten regional branch clinics. These clinics provide a full range of medical and dental services to over 100,000 enrollees in addition to providing direct clinical support to 50,000 operational forces located in the Hampton Roads area. DPC is a core member of Naval Medical Center Portsmouth's (NMCP) Command Executive Board, requiring involvement in the governance of hospital operations and the Personnel Management Resource Board. The DPC is a full time position. However, there is opportunity and it is encouraged to continue using one's clinical skill set on a limited, part-time basis.

The Directorate is additionally responsible for the command's Individual Medical Readiness (IMR) and Independent Duty Corpsman (IDC) programs. The DPC also serves as NMCP's Medical Homeport Champion.

The Directorate leadership consists of the Director, the Associate Director, a Business Manager, a Senior Enlisted Leader, and three clinical triad Officers-in-Charge (OIC). Each OIC is directly responsible for three or four branch clinics and reports to the DPC. The Directorate is comprised of more than 1,400 active duty, civilian and contract staff personnel.

The position is open to Medical Department officers of all Corps at the O-5/O-6 level. The preferred candidate will have the following attributes:

- 1) A track record of broad superior performance in both clinical and leadership positions;
- 2) Comprehensive understanding of Navy Medicine's Medical Home Port model;
- 3) Significant organizational, interpersonal, and collaborative skills;
- 4) Proven record in program oversight, management, and business acumen;
- 5) Superior military bearing; and
- 6) Proven ability to function in operational settings.
