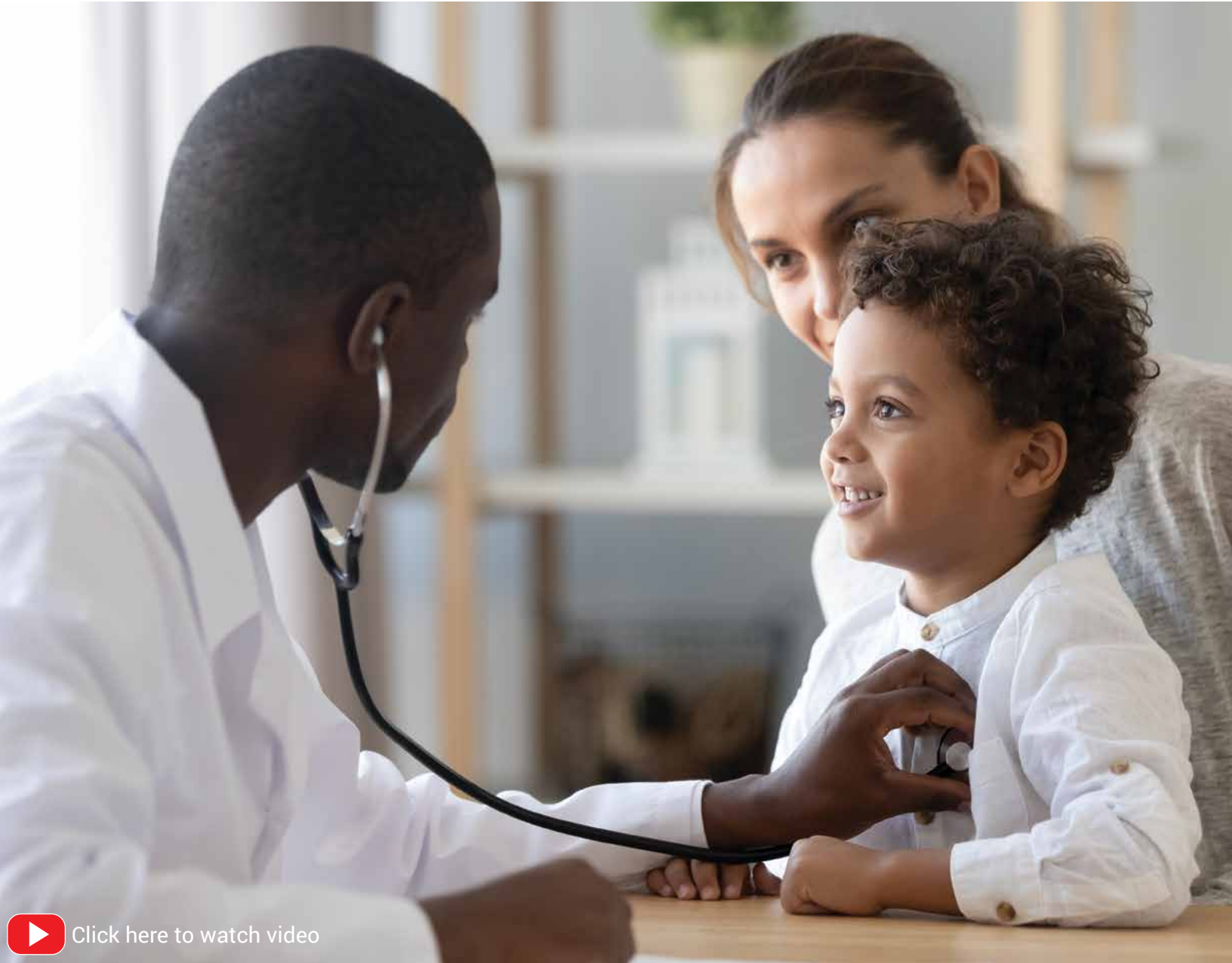

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE NAVY FAP, STUDENTS MUST BE:

- Graduates of medical school or currently enrolled in medical school and accepted to an approved residency program
- At least 18 years old, less than 42 years old
- U.S. citizen or naturalized U.S. citizen

TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE NAVY HPSP, YOU MUST BE:

- Accepted into the next entering class or currently enrolled in a school of medicine in the United States and Puerto Rico, that is accredited by LCME or COCA
- At least 18 years old, less than 42 years old
- U.S. citizen or naturalized U.S. citizen

MEDICAL SCHOOL DEBT-FREE?

Navy Medical Corps has a plan for you.

Imagining your life as a physician is one thing; getting there is another. The Navy Medical Corps has effective ways of helping you finance the cost of your training. If you are a U.S. citizen and meet the Navy's physical standards, you may qualify for one of the following programs.

THE NAVY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (FAP):

Allows you to concentrate on your specialty without worrying about your finances. During your residency or fellowship, the Navy will pay you an annual grant and a monthly stipend – on top of any training program-based salary. Whether it is used for student loans, car payment, rent/mortgage or family expenses, you determine how the money is spent. Complete your program, obtain your board certification and enter the Navy as an Officer in the U.S. Navy Medical Corps debt-free! For qualifying specialties, please contact your local medical recruiter.

HEALTH PROFESSIONS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM (HPSP):

Covers 100% of medical school tuition – plus HPSP offers a monthly allowance to cover living expenses for up to four years. You will also earn a sign-on bonus of \$20,000.*

TO JOIN THE NAVY MEDICAL CORPS, YOU MUST:

- Have graduated from an eligible medical school accredited by the LCME or the COCA
- Have completed one year of graduate school in a program approved by the AMA or AOA (interns currently in training may also apply)
- Have a current state medical license within one year of entering the Navy Medical Corps
- Be able to complete 20 years of active duty service prior to age 62
